George Darrington called the meeting to order.

Minutes from Last Meeting. The February minutes were read and approved.

Proposed Road Board and other updates regarding area road issues. Commissioner Dennis Crane provided more information regarding a proposed recreation of a Road Board. The commissioner said that it was a suggestion that got a lot more newspaper exposure than the commission spent discussing it. He said he brought the idea up because he has had very few complaints about road issues. The commissioners talked it over and felt that Sam and Commissioner Crane had a good working relationship, but Dennis was concerned that he was not getting enough comments and thinks that more might come if there was a local delegate to talk with. He thought 3 delegates rather than the previous 5 would work. Any decisions would still be governed by the commissioners, so the 3 delegates would strictly be advisory and chosen by the commissioners. 3 advisors fit the state government plan.

Lavelle Erickson feels that no complaints are coming because folks are worried there could be retribution for complaining. He felt that in the past, some plowing priorities were set by who was on the old board. He felt it would be good to have a board that Dennis was on so he votes. Lavelle also felt that we need product on the gravel roads. Sam replied that in the old days, any product was used, but that caused problems and now they are trying to get the right stuff rather than suffer the problems of using the wrong stuff.

Scott Erickson said that we don't really have the best product around here and the roads will reflect that no matter how well Sam works it. He felt the road board was unnecessary, just call Sam. Don't yell at him, just let him know where there are problems. Scott said that after his stint of road maintenance, he would never complain about a road again.

Jay Black said he was amazed at how good the roads are. He said that he quit the road board when he had to quit pulling cars out.

More work needs to be done to correct the chip seal effort. There is a plan to fog coat the existing material, then redo the chip seal later. It has not been decided if the responsible party for the problem is the state or Kloeppfer. Since the state inspector passed the job, Kloeppfer feels the state is responsible.

The road will be taken over by the state sometime this spring. The snow removal agreement will give the work to Sam but they are still negotiating who will provide sand and/or salt.

Web Site. Dee Ann Spencer said the web site expired in January and we have to move to another. Someone in India took the name despite the fact that the name has nothing to do with the business.

GPS. Janice would like something that hooks up to the camera. We need to discuss this further and look into the options.

Kristen Bastis said that the information could be entered into the GIS data base.
