January 12, 1901 (No entry)

All went to Sunday School. I wrote to Eunice.

January 14, 1901

It is pretty cold weather. The wind blew all night awful bad.

January 15, 1901

I am better now at present.

January 16, 1901

Rosa and I went to Helen's to a quilting.

January 17, 1901

I went to Ida's. The children all got the mumps and Den also.

January 18, 1901 (No entry)

January 19, 1901

Nancy Jones came over to see the sick.

January 20, 1901

All better

January 21, 1901 – Sunday

I wrote to Emily and Ira.

January 22, 1901

Queen Victoria died. I helped Ida piece on her quilts.

January 23-24, 1901 (No entries)

January 25, 1901

Finished her quilt.

January 26, 1901

Hank and Rosa came over at night.

January 27, 1901 – Sunday

Den went to Sunday School and meeting. Ida and the children and I was all day alone. We read of the queen's death.

January 28, 1901

I am well again.

January 29, 1901

Rosa and Hank came after me.

January 30, 1901

I am not very well. I had a chill.

January 31, 1901 (No entry)

February 1901

February 1, 1901 (No entry)

February 2, 1901 – Sunday
I stayed alone. Am sick.

February 3, 1901 (No entry)

February 4, 1901
I am piecing me a Jacob's Ladder quilt.

February 5, 1901 (No entry)

February 6, 1901
Euney's baby is sick.

February 7-8, 1901 (No entries)

February 9, 1901 – Sunday
I wrote to Emily and Eva.

February 10-11, 1901 (No entries)

February 12 & 13, 1901
I am not very well. Mary Ann's baby is sick.

February 14, 1901
Euney's baby no better.

February 15, 1901 (No entry)

February 16, 1901
Rosa has gone to see Euney's baby. It is very sick.

February 17, 1901
I went to Mary Ann's.

February 18, 1901
Euney's baby died today.

February 19, 1901
It is buried today.

February 20, 1901 (No entry)

February 21, 1901

The children came home from school from Albion. Erny, Mary Ann and Ida.

February 22, 1901

A dance to the meeting house. The girls all went.

February 23, 1901

We are piecing quilts.

February 24-25, 1901 (No entry)

February 26, 1901

I came back to Rosa's. She came after me.

February 27, 1901

Rosa cooking to go to the Jubalee tomorrow.

February 28, 1901

I went to Helen's. The Jubalee is over.

March 1901

March 1-2, 1901 (No entries)

March 3, 1901 – Sunday

I came to Rosa's. She came and got me.

March 4, 1901

Ida Durfee's birthday.

March 5, 1901

I darned stockings today for Rosa.

March 6, 1901

Mary Ann's birth. I went to Helen's and stayed while Rosa went a teaching and gathering wheat for the Relief Society. I came back with her at night. Ida and Den moved in the Cove.

March 7, 1901

I am to Rosa's. My toe is so sore.

March 8, 1901

I can't work.

March 9, 1901

My foot is some better. Hank and Rosa have gone to the store.

March 10, 1901 – Sunday

March 11, 1901

Rosa Cullard.

March 12, 1901

We sewed rags.

March 13, 1901

Nancy was here a visiting. Rosa washed. I sewed.

March 14-15, 1901 (No entries)

March 16, 1901

Mary Ann went to Albion. Rosa and I went to the store.

March 17, 1901

I am to Rosa's. I had a chill, am sick.

March 18, 1901

I am sick today.

March 19, 1901 (No entry)

March 20, 1901

I am some better.

March 21-22, 1901 (No entries)

March 23, 1901

I can sew rags.

March 24, 1901

I am sewing rags.

March 25-30, 1901 (No entries)

March 31, 1901 – Sunday.

Fast day today. Ida and Den came home with Rosa. I went to Mary Ann's. Mame came after me. Emily and Payne come to Steve's.

April 1901

April 1, 1901

I am helping Mary Ann piece quilts.

April 2, 1901

Emily and Nan came to Bill's.

April 3-4, 1901 (No entries)

April 5 & 6, 1901

Conference Commences. The children came home from school to go to the mutual dance.

April 7, 1901 – Sunday

All gone to Sunday School but Mary Ann and me.

April 8, 1901

I am to work as usual.

April 9, 1901 (No entry)

April 10, 1901

John Durfee married. A dance tonight.

April 11, 1901

I went to Rosa's. She came after me. I stayed 2 days and then went to Helen's.

April 12-13, 1901 (No entries)

April 14, 1901 – Sunday

I am to Helen's. I have wrote to Eunice Ward.

April 15, 1901 – Monday

I went to Rosa's today. They branded cattle. Nelle came with me.

April 16, 1901 – Tuesday

Rosa washed. I went out doors in the afternoon, caught cold, had a slight chill.

April 17, 1901 – Wednesday

Nellie Owsley came down, stayed all day. Rosa ironed and cooked to go to Jenson's.

April 18, 1901 – Thursday

Rosa went to Jenson's. I stayed with the children.

April 19, 1901 – Friday

Rosa got home. Nellie came down and her way to (?), stayed all day with me. Rosa met Ida at the river, camped for dinner.

April 20, 1901 – Saturday

I am not feeling well. Mame, Ernie, Mary Ann and Helen all came to see me.

April 21, 1901 – Sunday

Rosa and family went to Sunday School. Stayed all alone.

April 22, 1901 – Monday

Rosa went over to see Mrs. Ousely. I went and stayed up to Mamies all day and all night, not feeling well.

April 23, 1901 – Tuesday

Sick all day. Hank and Rosa cut potatoes and planted them.

April 24, 1901 – Wednesday

I feel a little better. Rosa and Hank went over to see Owsley's start. Mary Ann came up a little while and Nellie came down a little while.

April 25, 1901 – Thursday

I am not feeling well. A little better if anything.

April 26, 1901 – Friday

Not much better. Mary Ann came up to see me.

April 27, 1901 – Saturday

I sent for Mrs. Green and Nellie went to Bro. King's birthday dinner. Worse today.

April 28, 1901 – Sunday

Bishop and his counselors came down and administered to me. I am a little better. Mary Ann, Wm, Tom, Nellie, Emma Heath and little Nell, Nancy came down in the afternoon to see me.

April 29, 1901 – Monday

Some better. Rosa sent up to Mrs. Taylor's and Aunt Jones's (or Janis?) I stayed alone.

April 30, 1901 – Tuesday

Rosa and Hank went to plant garden and I went to Nellies. She washed. Rosa came after me at night.

May 1901

May 1, 1901 – Wednesday

Rosa washed. I am some better. Ida and Den got home.

May 2, 1901 – Thursday

Rosa ironed and white washed the kitchten. I pieced on her wooling quilt. Mame came over to see me in the afternoon. Den came also.

May 3, 1901 – Friday

I am sick. Had a hard chill this morning. I was a bed all day.

May 4, 1901

The girls came to see me. I have not seen Ida yet since she came home from Malad.

May 5, 1901 – Sunday

Ida and all my girls came to see me. I am better.

May 6, 1901

I am much better today. Rosa gone to the old place to plant potatoes.

May 7, 1901

I am better today. I have been sewing carpet rags. Rosa making soap and working at a little of everything.

May 8, 1901

I feel some better. I have been sewing carpet rags. Rosa has been washing and finished her soap.

May 9, 1901

I am better today. Sewing on Rosa's wooling quilt.

May 10, 1901

Better.

May 11, 1901

Getting better again.

May 12, 1901 (No entry)

May 13, 1901

I went to Mary Ann's to stay while Rosa planted her garden. Ida moved to the little cove.

May 14, 1901

I pieced on my delane quilt.

May 15, 1901

I pieced. The girls went back to school to Albion and Maud came back.

May 16, 1901

Earny went to Pole Creek.

May 17, 1901

I pieced on my quilt.

May 18, 1901

I went to Rosa's.

May 19, 1901

I am sick had the stomach ache. They all went to Ida's but Nina and me. I was sick all day.

May 20, 1901

I am a little better.

May 21, 1901

I sewed a little.

May 22, 1901

Some better.

May 23, 1901

Rosa washed.

May 24-30, 1901 (No entries)

May 31, 1901 - May the last.

We went to Rosa's to a quiltin', her Birthday. Aunt Rony, Mary Ann and Ida and that was all. Helen and Tom have been gone to Ogden a week today.

June 1901

Rosa is a quiltin'. I am not able to quilt.

June 2-4, 1901 (No entries)

June 5, 1901

Rosa went to Junction to see her husband. He is there shearing sheep.

June 6, 1901

I am to Helen's. She came after me.

June 7, 1901 (No entry)

Helen washed. I made me some black sleeves to my bask.

June 9, 1901 – Sunday
