November 27, 1899

I knit today.

The first (bliz) of the season. The thrashers came and finished Bill's thrashing.

November 30, 1899

They went to Hanks, finished there and went. I am most sick with a cough. It is a pleasant day.

December 1899

March 11, 1900 – Sunday
Bill went to George Creek. Mary Ann and (?) all alone. Bill is missionary.

March 12, 1900
I cut carpet rags.

March 13, 1900
I came to Rosa's.

March 14, 1900 (No entry)

March 15, 1900
Rosa has gone to decorate the meeting house for the 17th of March for the meeiting. I (?)

March 16, 1900
I went to Tom's to go with them.

March 17, 1900

I went. They had dinner and a dance in the afternoon.

March 18, 1900

April 1900

April 2, 1900

May 3, 1900

Helen and Mrs. Tucker came to Rosa's to make us a visit. Helen went to Mary Ann Wake's. She is awful sick.

May 4, 1900

Mary Ann is awful sick. She has to have watchers every night.

May 5-7, 1900 (No entries)

I am not very well. I have a pain in my stomach.

May 9, 1900 – Sunday

June 1900

June 1, 1900

Ruben better. Better today.

June 2, 1900

He's getting better all the time. The girls are to home. Maud Jones is working for them. I am to Bills all the week.

June 3, 1900 – Sunday

Ida came after me. Den gone to shere sheep for Jim Bronson. Hank went too. Ruben is better. The girls, Mary Ann and Ida (are) home. They are goin' back to school.

June 4, 1900

Ida gone to the store. I took care of the baby.

June 5, 1900

We sewed carpet rags.

June 6, 1900

We sewed. Ida went to a surprise in the evening.

June 7, 1900

Ida washed. Rosa came up and her children. We had a good visit.

June 8, 1900

We sewed carpet rags. It rained some today.

June 9, 1900

I finished the buds on my basket quilt. It has turned quite cold.

June 10, 1900 – Sunday

Jeney went to Sunday school. Ida and I are alone with the little children. Ida has 5 lambs to feed and 3 cows to milk. I am here with her at (?) until Den comes home.

June 11, 1900

Ida gone to town with her butter. Nancy and Mame came while she was gone. I am sewing carpet rags. She came back all right.

June 12, 1900

We sewed carpet rags.

June 13, 1900

Ida washed, I sewed on Jeney a dress.

June 14, 1900

I finished her dress. Rosa and the children came up.

June 15, 1900

I sewed.

June 16, 1900

I sewed.

June 17, 1900 – Sunday

Jeney gone to Sunday School. Ida and me all alone.

June 18, 1900

Ida went to the store and carried butter and eggs. Rosa came back with her and we had Ice Cream.

June 19, 1900

We finished her rags for her 30 yds. Of carpet. The men came home from sheering sheep.

June 20, 1900

Ida washed. I sewed.

June 21, 1900

I sewed, Ida ironed and Jennie helped her. I am to Ida's, been here most 3 weeks. I made aprons.

June 22, 1900

I went to Rosa's . Ida and I (we) bought ice and lemon and made ice cream.

June 23, 1900 (No entry)

June 24, 1900 – Sunday

The children went to Sunday School. Rosa stayed to home with me. Nina went to Barker's and got cherries.

June 25, 1900

It is awful hot weather, hottest ever known in Almo.

June 26, 1900

Rosa washed, I sewed.

June 27, 1900

Aunt Louise's birthday. I sewed. It is so hot we cannot do anything but lay in the shade.

June 28, 1900

Too hot to work.

June 29-30, 1900 (No entries)

July 1900

July 1-2, 1900 (No entries)

July 3, 1900

I came to Helen's to go with her to the 4th of July.

July 4, 1900

We went to the store and to the bowery.

July 5, 1900

It is very hot weather. Helen went to Relief (Society) meeting. I sewed.

July 6, 1900 (No entry)

July 7, 1900

Awful hot.

July 8, 1900

We went to Eunice and I stayed all night.

July 9, 1900

I came down to Helen's. Merl fetched me. John and Mary Ann was here. Helen has (poisend?) her face.

July 10, 1900

July 12, 1900

July 16, 1900

July 17, 1900
My mother's birthday.

July 18, 1900
Conference to Almo to the meeting house. Rosa went.

July 19, 1900
She washed. I pieced on my quilt - Jacob's Ladder.

July 20, 1900
Rosa ironed. I pieced on my quilt. The men cutting hay. Finished cutting and raking.

July 21, 1900
Today Jim Taylor began to cut wheat and some of Hanks. Joseph Arbon and wife and Emily came out here and visit.

July 22, 1900 - Sunday
All gone to Sunday school but me. I am alone.

July 23, 1900
The men hauling hay. It rained.

July 24, 1900
Home all day. Rosa and Hank and the children all went to the store.

July 25, 1900
Mary Ann Jones's birthday. Sweet Sixteen.

July 26, 1900
I got my new buggy from Eameses. (?) Hank, Rosa and me and the children all went to Grape Creek for a ride.

July 27, 1900
I sewed on Rosa's rug. She cooks for the men. They are not done haying. Rosa gone to practice the children for a holiday.

July 28, 1900
Helped Rosa do her Saturday's work.

July 29, 1900 - Sunday
We went up in the canyon.

July 30 & 31, 1900
Rosa cooking for Nines's birthday. I am piecing a quilt. Nina has gone to ask the little girls to her party. It is nice weather. Pretty hot today. Hank has got his hay all up in the stack. He is paying his work back to the (boys?).

August 1900

August 1, 1900

Rosa went and picked Alce Rices' currants

August 2, 1900 (No entry)

August 3, 1900

She washed. We had the water to water garden

August 4, 1900

I have been sick all day, done nothing.

August 5, 1900

I went to Mary Ann's.

August 6, 1900

Cut pieces for her quilt.

August 7, 1900

Cut pieces.

August 8, 1900

My birthday (73 years) Mary Ann Jr. made me a cake. It was nice. She gave me a box of envelopes and paper. Ida gave me a lice neck tie. Nina fetched me a new apron. We had a nice dinner. Mr. and Mrs. Lord?, was there came on business.

August 9, 1900

Mary Ann cooking for the primary doings. I came to Rosa's.

August 10, 1900

All gone to the doings. I read all day. A dance for the children in the afternoon. A dance for the big ones at night. Rosa and Hank went. The children stayed with me.

August 11, 1900 – Saturday

I am sick today, done nothing.

August 12, 1900

Hank and Rosa gone to Elba to conference. Children stayed with me. Cold night and hot days, nice weather.

August 13, 1900

We went a ride. I came home sick, had a chill.

August 14, 1900

Sick all day.

August 15, 1900

Helen came down and Eunice came with her.

August 16, 1900
I am better today.

August 17, 1900
We went to Ida's. I stayed and Rosa came back.

August 18, 1900

August 20, 1900

They went to Hank's and thrashed his and went to Bill's. I sewed. Helen washed ticks and quilts.

October 27, 1900

I went and stayed with Rosa. Hank no better.

They all went to meeting but Tom and me.

October 29, 1900

Helen went to cleaning house. I went to stay with Hank and see how he is, no better. I stayed til night and went to Ida's.

October 30, 1900

I went to Ida's and stayed a week.

November 1, 1900

I cut my woolen bask.

November 2-4, 1900 (No entries)

November 5, 1900 – Sunday

Den went to fast meeting. I stayed with Ida and the children.

November 6, 1900

I sewed.

November 7, 1900

Ida went to the store.

November 8, 1900

Mama was here.

November 9, 1900

Nancy Jones came and stayed all day. Den went and stayed with them. Hank is some better.

November 10, 1900

Nice pleasant weather.

November 11, 1900

I sewed.

November 12-16, 1900 (No entries)

November 17, 1900 – Sunday

It is stormy. Snowed and blowed all day. All stayed to home, it was so cold. Den has the teath ache.

Den went to mill last week – Thursday. Hank is some better, have not heard from him today.

November 18, 1900

Helen came over. Tom came with her and Eunice Heath?. I went home with her. Nancy was here all day. Tomey went hunting.

November 19, 1900

Euney stayed all night. Murl went with Tomey hunting.

November 20, 1900

Helen had a turkey for dinner. Murl and Euney and I and their own family to dinner. Hank and Rosa went to Ida's, the first time he been out since he was sick.

The first of December. Cold and stormy, wind blowing.

December 2, 1900 - Sunday

I went to Mary Ann's. The girls are to home from school and Erney. Mame is here. Rosa came after me at night.

December 3, 1900

Rosa is cleaning house. Cleaned the big room.

She washed.

December 5, 1900

She white washed and cleaned the kitchen. Put down her carpet in the kitchen.

I am better. Jess went for the girls to Albion to come home for Christmas.

December 23, 1900

Mame Johnson's birthday. I went to Rosa's today. I got an awful cold.

December 24, 1900 (No entry)

December 25, 1900

Den and Ida and all the children came over. We had a good time.

December 26-28, 1900 (No entries)

December 29 -31, 1900

Helen came down after me. I went to her house and watched the old year out and the new year in. Eunice Heith was there with a baby 2 weeks old. There as a dance to the log hall.
